### **CALL FOR RESIDENT WORKSHOP**

## CONTRIBUTION TO THE TRAINING OF OUR RESIDENTS AND TO THE LIFE OF THE ECBHM

As you probably know the ECBHM organizes a workshop for its residents every year with the aim to improve their knowledge and skills, and to increase the degree on interaction between them. The topics addressed during these workshops are wide. Some topics (as nutrition, epidemiology, infectious diseases, interpretation of ancillary tests, collection and treatment of herd data for instance) are chosen not only to improve the knowledge of our resident in those areas but also to ensure that our residents share a common language and share their experiences. But the workshops are also the occasion to deal with topics as genomic selection or animal health economic which are not easily addressed in all the institutions.

Historically the first workshops were organized in Munich. For the first time in 2011, a workshop was organized outside from Munich in Toulouse, France. In 2012, Berne welcomed the last ECBHM workshop devoted to the interpretation of herd data. This workshop was a joint workshop between ECBHM and ECVPH (European College of Veterinary Public Health).

For the forthcoming year, the Workshop which will be organized in Nantes, France, will be focused on animal welfare and pain management. The recent insights related to the interest of modelling approach to design and assess effective control actions towards infectious diseases will be also presented (the detailed program of the WS will be available on the ECBHM website).

For the organization of the ECBHM Workshops for residents in upcoming years we would like to call for declarations of interest. To organize a workshop is a great opportunity to serve the college and help our residents, it also represents a wonderful experience to discuss and share scientific and convivial moments with colleagues and residents from all over Europe. The topics that could be addressed are open.

Regarding financial aspects: expenses of the residents (accommodation and coffee/lunch breaks) and expenses of external speakers, if any, are paid by the college. No payment is included for the organizers of the workshop. Rooms for the workshop, "local" speakers and sponsors for a workshop dinner if there is one, have to be provided by the organizers.

### LOOKING FOR DATA ON LAPAROSCOPIC ABOMASOPEXY

Recently we have introduced Laparoscopic abomasopexy for our farm animal clients (Paragon Veterinary Group, Newbiggin, Cumbria, UK). This technique is relatively unused in the UK and only a few farm animal practices offer it to their clients. A lot of scepticism amongst the veterinarians here exists regarding success rates compared to conventional Grymer-Sterner and surgical approaches.

- Does anyone have data results (survival rates, recurrence rates etc.) on 1-step standing compared two 2-step laparoscopic abomasopexy technique?
- Does anyone have any data on recurrence rates (recurrence of LDA after previously performed correction) of surgery, Grymer-Sterner and laparoscopic abomasopexy?
- What are the recommendations? one-step versus two-step?
