WORKSHOP FOR RESIDENTS IN TOULOUSE by *Catherine Carty, UCD, Dublin, Ireland*

This year the annual ECBHM resident's workshop was held in Toulouse University. The growing number of residents was as enthusiastic as ever and some significant learning was well balanced with plenty of socialising. The first morning saw ECBHM President Ingrid Lorenz welcome the group before it was kick started by Dr D. Raboisson. He was straight into the theory of economics and provided a meaningful insight to the economics of production diseases, endemic diseases, eradication of disease on the national level and emerging diseases. This detailed introduction was followed by some application of economic theory to farm problem solving delivered by Dr. D. Raboisson and Prof P. Sans, which over the course of the 2 days introduced applied economics practiced in the area of control of respiratory diseases, mastitis and parasites. The residents were working in groups and after attempts at solo calculations; the problems were discussed in detail together. After a long day at the vet school the group was treated to a tour of Toulouse by the local residents, after the beautiful scenery was admired it was off to the pub for some socialising. Monday night also included a lucky fondue restaurant in Toulouse play host to a proportion of residents stumble upon it on the way home. Day 2 provided more education on economics where the economics of disease eradication and surveillance was discussed before practical sessions. Tuesday afternoon provided time for the tourists among us visit the airbus factory and take a tour where the not so inclined had a few hours to spare before the main social event which was held at the prestigious *Le Perche Pinte* restaurant where everyone experienced the delight of French cuisine, washed down with the finest French wine and plenty of conversation. The final morning everyone was not so bright eyed but another morning of learning was delivered by Prof E. Wauters which delivered a further excellent insight into the world of animal health economics. The entire workshop was excellently organised and delivered by Dr D. Raboisson helpfully aided by residents Vincent, Nicolas and Enrico. Massive thanks to all involved for another successful, educational and enjoyable workshop.
