#### **Deadline for Diplomate recertification changed!**

Every practicing Diplomate is due for credentials recertification in a five-years interval. The deadline for credentials submission is **November 1**<sup>st</sup> of each year. This change was implemented to allow sufficient time for the Credentials Committee to handle incomplete dossiers requiring revisions. If you are unsure in which year you are due for recertification, please log-on to our website and your personal dashboard on the website (visible after having logged in) will display the date of your next recertification. Submissions of credential dossiers are only accepted electronically through the database.

## European Buiatrics Congress (EBC) and ECBHM Jubilee Symposium

The European Buiatrics Congress and ECBHM Jubilee Symposium took place in Berlin from Aug. 24th to 26th, 2023. This meeting was organized by the German Veterinary Medical Association, the German Buiatrics Association and the ECBHM. It attracted over 600 delegates from approximately 40 countries. The scientific program included 9 keynote addresses, 70 oral presentations and over 120 posters. The ECBHM organized a round table discussing "the biggest challenge in cattle practice: How to recruit and retain the next generation of veterinarians". This event was moderated by Wolfgang Heuwieser and included 8 panelists coming from various countries across Europe. It covered different farm practice structures, academia and the dairy farmers perspective. As in previous years, the ECBHM was present at the industry exhibit with its new booth.

This event provided an excellent opportunity to celebrate the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our college as a veterinary specialty college certified by the EBVS. Hundred diplomates and residents were present at the Jubilee Dinner, which took place at the congress venue immediately following our AGM. #### Resident workshop 2023 in Hanover, Germany

This year's resident workshop entitled "non-reproductive ultrasonography" took place at the Clinic for cattle of the University of Veterinary Medicine Hannover on Aug. 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup>. A group of 26 ECBHM residents from across Europe spent two days practicing and developing their ultrasound skills on cows and calves as well as on cadaver specimens, rotating through different stations. The workshop included a welcome BBQ as well as dinner evening, providing excellent opportunities for our residents to network.

The event was hosted by the ECBHM and, as usual, was free of charge for our residents. The workshop was only possible thanks to the generous support of the clinic for Cattle in Hannover who unhesitatingly provided us with facilities, personnel and equipment. Thanks also to Veticon for making ultrasound equipment available for this workshop.
